
Hints and Ideas Spring 2022



Use cardstock for best results. Cut size 6 1/2 "x 5 1/2 " Draw circle...about 3 1/2" diameter Note the mountain and valley folds and where to cut. This fits a 4 1/4x 5 3/4 envelope. Eleanor's Twirly card sample. You can write

Eleanor's Twirly card sample. You can write or glue onto the 'twirly' center circle. For Eleanor's card here, more sparkles and calligraphy are

Simple lettering guide for envelopes: size of paper (or plastic) 7 1/2x5". Draw 1/2' lines then 1/4" lines until you have 4 1/2 spaces. If you do this on plastic, the writing space is defined for you.



Following our February guild meeting, Eleanor Lippman gave a brief presentation on how to use 'ModPodge' to create cards or images to frame. These are her examples:





Tools:

Mod Podge (Gloss Luster), Tacky Glue, old paint brush, small container for Mod Podge, newspaper or equivalent for protecting your work surface. Collect autumn leaves and flatten and dry them in a telephone book or something similar.

Pour a small amount of Mod Podge in a container, arrange the leaves on newspaper and paint one surface with a light coat of Mod Podge. While your leaves are drying, move them around a bit to prevent them from sticking to the newspaper. Wash the brush and container.

When the leaves have dried, turn them over and repeat on the back side. Wash the brush and container. Prepare more leaves than you think you will need as sometimes the Mod Podge creates a "bubble" making that leaf unusable.

Dried leaves can be stored in a plastic bag or container. Tacky Glue is perfect for securing leaves to paper.





Maurice at work Spring 2022
